Day 1: Depart U.S. for Marseille, France

Day 2: Arrive Marseille/Aix-en-Provence We arrive in Marseille and transfer to Aix-en-Provence (“Aix”). This evening we meet our Odysseys Tour Director and fellow travelers at a briefing about the journey ahead, followed by a welcome dinner at our hotel. *D*

Day 3: Aix-en-Provence Today we discover this lovely “City of Fountains” on a walking tour, admiring Aix’s rich architectural heritage and the “Vielle Ville” (Old Town). After a guided visit to the Atelier Cézanne, where artist Paul Cézanne worked from 1902 to 1906, we have lunch at a local restaurant. The remainder of the day is free to enjoy Aix as we wish and for dinner on our own. *B,L*

Day 4: Aix-en-Provence/Arles/Castillon-du-Gard We travel this morning to Arles, once part of Roman Gaul then a clarion of Christianity, and more recently, where Van Gogh painted. We encounter the city’s rich history on our walking tour, which includes a visit to the two-tiered Roman Amphitheater, a UNESCO site dating to 90 CE and preserved virtually intact; and Place du Forum, setting for Van Gogh’s painting “Café du Nuit.” Then we have free time for lunch on our own before we depart for Castillon-du-Gard. We dine tonight at a local restaurant. *B,D*

Day 5: Castillon-du-Gard/Avignon After a brief walking tour this morning, we have time on our own to explore the monuments to nearby Nîmes’ Roman heyday, including the 2,000-year-old Nîmes Arena; the perfectly preserved Maison Carrée; and the Tour Magne, the only remaining tower of the original city walls. This afternoon we depart for Avignon, capital of Christendom in the Middle Ages. Here we visit the historic city center with its 12th-century Romanesque Cathedral, the remains of the Saint-Bénézet Bridge, and the Gothic *Palais des Papes* (Papal Palace) where the Avignon popes lived during the 14th century. Tonight we join a local chef for a Provençal cooking class followed by dinner. *B,D*

Day 6: Castillon-du-Gard/Les-Beaux-de-Provence/Saint-Rémy-de-Provence We set out this morning for Les Beaux, a gem of a medieval village perched atop a rock spur. Our first stop: the Carrières de Lumière multimedia/art exhibit set in a former stone quarry. Then we explore Les Beaux itself, considered one of the country’s most beautiful villages. We continue on to Saint Rémy, where we enjoy lunch together before visiting the Gallo-Romanesque jewel of St-Paul de Mausole, where Van Gogh was confined after severing his ear. *B,L*

Day 7: Castillon-du-Gard/Pont du Gard/Lyon Heading north this morning, we stop at Pont du Gard, the 1st-century Roman aqueduct whose three graceful tiers of arches span the Gardon River. Then we travel on to Lyon, France's third largest city set at the confluence of the Rhone and Saône rivers. We dine tonight at a local restaurant in this region famed for its gastronomy. *B,D*

Day 8: Lyon Today's tour begins at the beloved Basilica of Notre-Dame de Fourvière, overlooking riverside Lyon from its hilltop perch. Next: the ruins of the Gallo-Roman theater, built in 15 BCE and still in use today. We then visit Vieux Lyon, the city's well-preserved Renaissance district, followed by a look at some of Lyon's jaw-dropping – and renowned – *trompe l'oeil* street art. The remainder of the day is free for independent exploration before we dine tonight at a local restaurant. *B,D*

Day 9: Lyon/Pérouges/Annecy Setting out today for lakeside Annecy in the French Alps, we stop en route in medieval hilltop Pérouges, another of France's most beautiful villages with its cobblestone streets and byways flanked by half-timbered houses. Then we continue on to Annecy on the shores of its namesake lake. We stroll through the charming Old Town, with its streetside canals and pastel-hued houses; visit the vibrant Sunday market; and enjoy a cruise on Lake Annecy, whose pristine waters are fed by the surrounding Alps. *B*

Day 10: Lyon/Beaune/Dijon This morning we travel to Beaune, gateway to the Burgundy wine region. We take a leisurely walking tour of this walled town then have time for lunch on our own. This afternoon we visit the renowned Hôtel Dieu Museum, part of the Hospices de Beaune complex, one of the finest surviving Renaissance buildings in France and home to the Beaune Altarpiece (often called “The Last Judgment”). Then we continue on to Dijon and our hotel, where we dine tonight. *B,D*

Day 11: Dijon/Dole/Routes des Grands Crus Today's first stop is in untouristed Dole, with its well-preserved historic center and where we enjoy a walking tour and visit to the home of scientist Louis Pasteur. Then a tour highlight: the journey along the Routes des Grands Crus, Burgundy's fabled trail through the vineyards and villages comprising one of France's most treasured wine regions. We have the opportunity to taste some area vintages at lunch together and at a local winery. *B,L*

Day 12: Dijon Known for its rich history and culture – and of course, its wine and namesake mustard – Dijon boasts a prized architectural heritage ranging from Gothic to art deco, which we see on today's tour of the Burgundian capital. Following our tour, we're free to explore as we wish. Tonight, we visit a local restaurant for dinner together. *B,D*

Day 13: Dijon/Chablis/Paris En route to Paris today, we stop in Chablis, renowned for its signature dry white wines. We enjoy a walking tour of the medieval village and visit the 13th-century Collégiale Saint-Martin church. Then we have time on our own for lunch and to explore as we wish, maybe visiting one of wineries in the town center. Mid-afternoon we travel on to Paris, where an orientation tour takes us past many of the city's highlights. Dinner tonight is on our own in this city of fine cuisine. *B*

Meet Your Faculty Lecturer

Professor Teofilo Ruiz

Teofilo Ruiz received his doctorate from Princeton University and has taught at many universities, including the University of Michigan and Princeton. He served as UCLA History Department chair (2002-2005) and chair of the Department of Spanish and Portuguese (2008-2009).

The author of 14 books, he received the prestigious 2007 Guggenheim Fellowship and the Distinguished Teacher Award at UCLA. In 2012, Ruiz was selected as the Senior Research Lecturer at UCLA and received the National Humanities Medal from President Obama. With 18 past tours, Professor Ruiz is the most popular and beloved lecturer traveling with UCLA Alumni Travel.

Day 14: Paris This morning we visit the Opéra Garnier, the opulent theater that stands as a symbol of the city (and as the setting for *The Phantom of the Opera*). If Opéra Garnier is not available, we'll tour the Musée Rodin, dedicated to the works of sculptor Auguste Rodin. Our afternoon is free for independent exploration; tonight we celebrate our Gallic sojourn over a farewell dinner. *B,D*

Day 15: Depart for U.S. We transfer to the airport this morning for our return flight to the U.S. *B*

General Terms and Conditions

The following is intended to provide you with a description of what to expect when you reserve a tour with Odysseys Unlimited. Upon booking, you will be asked to acknowledge your acceptance of the full Terms and Conditions on My Odyssey, our secure on-line portal.

Tour Prices

Tour prices quoted are guaranteed through December 31, 2025, and include accommodations based on double occupancy; airfare from your departure city; airline taxes, surcharges, and fees, and port charges and cruise line fees (where applicable), which are subject to change until final payment has been made; internal air, rail, and motorcoach transportation; meals, sightseeing, and transfers as described; hotel taxes; entrance fees for included sightseeing; the services of an Odysseys Unlimited Tour Director; services of a UCLA Lecturer or Host with a minimum of 15 travelers; luggage handling for one bag per person; and all gratuities as described below. Please note that the cost of air upgrades is subject to change.

Gratuities

Tour prices include all gratuities for local guides, dining room servers, airport and hotel porters, and all drivers on base tours and on optional extensions when accompanied by an Odysseys Unlimited representative. Please note that gratuities for the Odysseys Unlimited Tour Director and shipboard personnel (if a cruise is included in your tour) are not included. These tips are optional and should be extended on a voluntary basis. Gratuities are not included on “On Your Own” optional extensions.

Not Included in Your Tour Price

Airfare from your hometown to your departure city; costs of passports and visas; personal expenses such as beverages, laundry, room service, and meals not specified; immunizations and inoculations; communications charges;

airport transfers when purchasing a land-only package; gratuities to your Odysseys Unlimited Tour Director and shipboard personnel (if a cruise is included in your tour), which are at your discretion (suggested gratuities: \$10-\$15 per guest, per day); and a Travel Protection Plan. Additional baggage fees levied directly by the airline(s) may apply and are subject to change at any time. You should confirm directly with your airline(s) prior to departure.

Registration and Payment

A deposit of \$500 per person confirms your reservation. Full payment is due at least 95 days prior to departure and may be made by personal check or credit card. Odysseys Unlimited, Inc. reserves the right to cancel any reservations that are not paid in full at any time after final payment is due. If you make your reservation after the final payment date, payment in full will be required upon reservation.

Cancellations and Refunds

If you must cancel your tour, the effective date of cancellation will be upon our receipt of your written notification. Refunds for cancellations are subject to the following per person charges:

Pre-Departure

Upon reservation, you will be able to access all information regarding your tour in My Odyssey, our secure on-line portal. This material includes your invoice, a detailed day-by-day itinerary, visa requirements (if applicable), and more. Your final tour documents, including airline itineraries (with e-ticket numbers), will be available in the portal two to three weeks before departure.

Single Travelers

We welcome single travelers, and offer a limited number of single accommodations on each tour. Because hotel and cruise rates are priced by the room or cabin, the per person cost for accommodations occupied by one person is higher than that shared by two people. We will endeavor to keep single supplements at a reasonable cost. Please note that single rooms in many foreign hotels may be smaller than those to which you are accustomed.

Changes to Your Reservation

We will not charge a fee for any changes made to your reservation outside of 95 days before departure. From 94 to 30 days before departure, if you make any changes to your reservation, a \$100 per person administrative fee will apply, in addition to any fees or penalties imposed by airlines, hotels, or other third parties. Changes are subject to availability and cannot be guaranteed. If your reservation changes from double occupancy to single occupancy for any reason or at any time, you will be charged the single supplement.

Please note that no changes to your name(s) or departure date are allowed within 95 days of departure. No changes to your reservation can be made within 30 days of departure.

Required Information

Upon reservation, we will need to obtain from you the following, in accordance with the Transportation Security Administration's (TSA) Secure Flight program (for details, please visit www.tsa.gov), as well as for our travel partners: **for international tours – your full name as it appears on your passport, date of birth, and gender; for domestic tours – your full name as it appears on the accepted form of government-issued photo identification that you plan to use, date of birth, and gender.** In addition, airlines may require that we provide them with your contact information prior to departure. In the event an airline ticket is issued with incorrect information you have provided, or if you use a different passport (international tours) or other form of government issued photo identification (domestic tours) than originally cited, you will be responsible for charges associated with the ticket's reissue.

Travel Documents

A passport valid for at least six months after the completion of your tour is required for U.S. citizens on all of our international tours. For all domestic tours, where we fly into a U.S. city to begin the tour or out of a U.S. city at the end, you must present a valid U.S. government-issued photo identification. Starting on May 7, 2025, your government-issued photo ID must be REAL ID-compliant (or you can present an alternate form of ID, such as a passport). Visit www.dhs.gov/real-id or contact your local DMV for more information. If your tour requires a visa(s), we strongly recommend that you have at least six blank visa pages available; for tours not requiring a visa(s), we recommend that your passport have at least three blank visa pages. We will send you specific visa and entry requirements after you make a reservation. You are responsible for obtaining these documents. If you need to obtain a visa, we recommend our preferred provider G3 Global Services. If you are traveling with a minor, please contact us for special entry requirements. If you are not a U.S. citizen, please contact your embassy or consulate to ensure you obtain the proper documentation.

Smoking

For the convenience of the majority of our travelers, Odysseys Unlimited, Inc. has a No Smoking policy (including e-cigarettes and vaping) on all tour buses. We will arrange sufficient rest stops so those who wish to smoke may do so.

Health and Medical Issues

We welcome all travelers, but request that you be in good health to participate in an Odysseys Unlimited, Inc. tour. All of our tours involve a reasonable amount of walking (typically two to three miles per day), often uphill or on uneven or cobblestone streets.

You must be able to get on and off motorcoaches and boats on your own. We regret that we cannot provide individual assistance if you require the use of a wheelchair or have other personal needs; in such cases you must be accompanied by a companion who will assist you. Please note that many of our itineraries, for reasons beyond our control, do not accommodate wheelchairs. Please call or e-mail us to inquire and we will do our best to answer any questions you may have.

We reserve the right to remove anyone whose physical condition or behavior, in our opinion, compromises the operation of the tour or detracts from the enjoyment or safety of the other tour members. While we do our best to accommodate food allergy concerns, we cannot guarantee zero cross-contamination.

Air Transportation
